#### **RESOLUTION 2025-01**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE FALLSCHASE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT APPROVING A PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/2026 AND SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON PURSUANT TO FLORIDA LAW; ADDRESSING TRANSMITTAL, POSTING AND PUBLICATION REQUIREMENTS; ADDRESSING SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the District Manager has heretofore prepared and submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Fallschase Community Development District ("District") prior to June 15, 2025, a proposed budget ("Proposed Budget") for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026 ("Fiscal Year 2025/2026"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has considered the Proposed Budget and desires to set the required public hearing thereon.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE FALLSCHASE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

- 1. **PROPOSED BUDGET APPROVED.** The Proposed Budget prepared by the District Manager for Fiscal Year 2025/2026 attached hereto as **Exhibit A** is hereby approved as the basis for conducting a public hearing to adopt said Proposed Budget.
- 2. **SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING.** A public hearing on said approved Proposed Budget is hereby declared and set for the following date, hour and location:

**DATE:** August 4, 2025

**HOUR:** 1:30 p.m.

**LOCATION:** 2810 Remington Green Circle

- 3. **TRANSMITTAL OF PROPOSED BUDGET TO LOCAL GENERAL-PURPOSE GOVERNMENT.** The District Manager is hereby directed to submit a copy of the Proposed Budget to Leon County at least 60 days prior to the hearing set above.
- 4. **POSTING OF PROPOSED BUDGET.** In accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District's Secretary is further directed to post the approved Proposed Budget on the District's website at least two days before the budget hearing date as set forth in Section 2, and shall remain on the website for at least 45 days.
- 5. **PUBLICATION OF NOTICE.** Notice of this public hearing shall be published in the manner prescribed in Florida law.

- 6. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of this Resolution shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining portions of this Resolution, or any part thereof.
- 7. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

A RESOLUTION OF THE FALLSCHASE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DESIGNATING DATES, TIMES AND LOCATIONS FOR REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025/2026 AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Fallschase Community Development District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government created and chartered by, and established and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, being situated entirely within Leon County, Florida; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Supervisors of the District ("Board") is statutorily authorized to exercise the powers granted to the District; and

**WHEREAS,** all meetings of the Board shall be open to the public and governed by the provisions of Chapter 286, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board is statutorily required to file annually, with the local governing authority and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity, a schedule of its regular meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE FALLSCHASE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

**SECTION 1. ADOPTING REGULAR MEETING SCHEDULE.** Regular meetings of the District's Board shall be held during Fiscal Year 2025/2026 as provided on the schedule attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

**SECTION 2. FILING REQUIREMENT.** In accordance with Section 189.015(1), *Florida Statutes*, the District's Secretary is hereby directed to file a schedule of the District's regular meetings annually with Leon County and the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity.

**SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

#### LEON COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER

AGREEMENT WITH LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SPECIAL DISTRICT) ENTITY ELECTING TO USE THE UNIFORM COLLECTION METHOD FOR NON-AD VALOREM ASSESSMENTS

THIS AGREEMENT WITH LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SPECIAL DISTRICT) ENTITY ELECTING TO USE THE UNIFORM COLLECTION METHOD FOR NON-AD VALOREM ASSESEMENTS ("Agreement") is made and entered into this day of Poly 10, 2025 by and between Fallschase CDD ("Special District""), whose address is 2300 Glades Road, Suite 410W Boca Raton, FL 33431 and the Honorable Akin Akinyemi, Property Appraiser in and for Leon County, Florida ("Property Appraiser").

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 197.3632(1)(b), Florida Statutes, the Special District, is a special district located within Leon County, Florida that is authorized to levy and collect non-ad valorem assessments; and

WHEREAS, the Special District has elected to levy and collect non-ad valorem assessments using the uniform collection method provided in Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, and

WHEREAS, Section 197.3632(2), Florida Statutes contemplates that a special district who chooses to levy and collect a non-ad valorem assessment enter into an agreement with the Property Appraiser providing for the reimbursement of necessary administrative costs incurred by the Property Appraiser with respect to the information provided by the Property Appraiser pursuant to Section 197.3632(3)(b), Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Special District and the Property Appraiser, for good and valuable consideration, do agree as follows:

1. Annually by June 1, provided the Special District has otherwise complied with the provisions of Section 197.3632, Florida Statutes, the property appraiser shall provide the Special District using the uniform method with the following information by list or compatible electronic medium: the legal description of the property within the boundaries described in the resolution required by Section 197.3632(3), Florida Statutes, and the names and addresses of the owners of such property. Such information shall reference the property identification number and otherwise conform in format to that contained on the ad valorem roll submitted to the department. The Property Appraiser is not required to submit information which is not on the ad valorem roll or compatible electronic medium submitted to the department. If the Special District determines that the information supplied by the property appraiser is insufficient for the local government's purpose, the local government shall obtain additional information from any other source.

- 2. Should the Property Appraiser so elect, the Special District shall reimburse the Property Appraiser for any and all necessary administrative costs incurred with respect to carrying out the provisions of paragraph 1 above. Administrative costs shall include, but not be limited to, those costs associated with personnel, forms, supplies, data processing, computer equipment, postage, and programming.
- The term of this Agreement shall commence upon execution, effective for 2025
   Tax Notice purposes, and shall continue and extend uninterrupted from year-to-year, automatically renewed for successive periods not to exceed one (1) year each.
- 4. This Agreement shall continue in full force and effect until terminated by the Property Appraiser and if not terminated by Property Appraiser, the Agreement shall continue until the Special District informs the Property Appraiser and the Department of Revenue, by January 10 of the calendar year, if the Special District intends to discontinue to use the uniform methodology for such Assessments pursuant to Section 197.3632(6), Florida Statutes and Rule 120-18.006(3), Florida Administrative Code, using Form DR-412 promulgated by the Florida Department of Revenue.
- 5. The Special District acknowledges and agrees that the Property Appraiser has no duty, authority or responsibility in the imposition and levy of any non-ad valorem special assessments, and that it is the sole responsibility and duty of the Special District to follow all procedural and substantive requirements for the levy and imposition of constitutionally lienable non-ad valorem special assessments.
- 6. To the extent permitted by applicable Florida law, and specifically subject to the provisions and dollar limitations set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, the Special District shall indemnify and hold harmless the Property Appraiser to the extent of any legal action which may be filed in local, state or federal courts against the Property Appraiser regarding the imposition, levy, roll preparation and certification of the assessments arising from the negligence of the Special District or its agents, officers, or employees; the Special District shall pay for or reimburse the Property Appraiser for fees for legal services rendered to Property Appraiser with regard to any such legal action. Nothing herein shall constitute a waiver of sovereign immunity or the limitations on liability provided under the Florida Constitution or general law.
- 7. The parties shall perform all their obligations under this Agreement in accordance with good faith and shall endeavor to assist each other in carrying out the provisions of this Agreement.
- 8. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein and may not be amended, modified or rescinded, unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, except in writing and signed by all the parties hereto. Should any provision of this Agreement be

declared to be invalid, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, unless such provision found to be invalid alters substantially the benefits or the Agreement for either of the parties or renders the statutory and regulatory obligations unable to be performed. All prior agreements between the parties hereto addressing the matters set forth herein are hereby terminated and superseded by this Agreement.

- 9. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida.
- 10. Written notice shall be given to the parties at the following addresses, or such other place or person as each of the parties shall designate by similar notice:
